Summarized changes to the LOTG; will put a communication together; given turnover at USSF nationally having trouble getting clarifications on some issues

- Drop balls will be preferential to one side, others and opponents to be 4 ½ yards away
- If GK tries to clear the ball with the feet and misplays, can pick it up with the hands
- On free kicks within the penalty area, ball in play when it's touched and moves (not when it's clear of the penalty area as previously)
- Attacking players can't be in the wall
- Keeper foot on the line during PK

Also referenced some other initiatives, including knowledge management system and implementing membership levels for tracking development

- Summary of rec club numbers; Lake City, Queen Anne, McGilvra holding; larger clubs including Ballard, LVR, Woodland and Hillwood are down; noted need to focus on advertising and marketing
- Volunteer certification process is ongoing; need to focus on assistant coaches and team managers; nobody should be on the roster without Safesport compliance and background check; priority is on assistant coaches so they can be on the roster for City Tournament

Andrew Westmark, Volunteer Coordinator

- Reported on SYSA summer camps which didn't populate and were cancelled
- Rec outreach training, almost all of the coaches have been recruited

- Continuation of rec outreach report: a number of clubs are staffed already; need information from Hillwood and Queen Anne regarding field setup and times
- Coaches clinics: some held, more are coming; ten clinics total including three with PCA, and some with Seattle United, Girl Boss Sports, Arena Sports
- Meeting with Seattle Parks: attended by Griffiths and Beckton
- 50th Anniversary: will kick off the season with event at Eaglestaff, 12-7 pm, September 7; hoping to get as much involvement and engagement to play in the games there, SU will bring the inflatable field and "JimmyDome"; golden scarf holders and Sounders will be there
- International visit: From a club that's in a suburb of Liverpool
- Web site/social media: Need pictures for the site; intern will be coming on board on August 15 to help with social media push
- TOPS Soccer: needs coach support

Old Business

Cut-off date adjustment for registration

Number of play-down requests has triggered this. Items mentioned during discussion:

- Current cutoff date is July 31, proposal is to move to August 31
- We receive between five and ten medical play down requests a year
- Play down requests often triggered for boys who were held out of school for a year; happens for boys more often than girls
- Some independent private schools use a June cutoff
- The registration software can only accommodate one cutoff

It was proposed that the next step is to survey parents of players with summer birthdays

Disciplinary Procedure & Policy

Item was skipped

Competitive Mis-match Policy (Discussion & Development)

With the inaction on the select player policy at the last meeting, outstanding question is how to manage mismatches. Among remedies discussed:

- Allow the team behind to add players, or some other form of a "mercy rule"
- Stop keeping score at some threshold
- Sportsmanship director as used at Woodland, who follows up if club sees blowout scores
- Foster a cultural shift starting in the mod leagues; coach education on how to manage blowouts; look up and keep track of blowouts and follow up
- Force teams to break up or play up a year

Parker offered that referees can enforce a policy if rules are black and white
